Dear Sir,

I am indebted to you for
your favor of this days date.

On Saturday last 2 Students
called upon me with reference to the disturbance
on a Chouraghee Car the previous day and
made a very strong case against the Company's
Employees which I did not dispute, until the
petitioner stated that two of their party
were carried from the Car into the Depot
Building and there brutally assaulted.
That I was so horrified and I told the
I gave a statement to the Charge of Constable
with a man, while thinking he would
would take advantage of it as made

to me states that 2 passengers who could not, or would not, produce Certificate were called upon to pay the full fare which they declined to do: they were asked for names which they also refused, they were then requested to leave the Car. that they declined to do. thereupon Mr Hippo Foreman of Chowringhee Depot stepped upon the Car for the purpose of removing them which he had a right to do, when some one on the Car struck him a violent blow on the Chest.

As soon as the 2 passengers were removed from the Car they were detained until the Police arrived. That was quite a legal course for the Company's officials to adopt under the circumstances. On the arrival of the Police the 2 Baboos were charged with refusing to pay the legal fare; behaving disorderly on the Car and obstructing the officials of the Company in the execution of their duty.

As soon as I heard the circumstances I gave directions for the charges to be withdrawn, little thinking that the Baboos would take advantage of this course to

make a Counter charge against our officials, which they have done.

If I am Correctly informed not one of the Students were assaulted no unnecessary force was used to take 2 offenders off the Car. They threw their arms around the Stanchion posts and caused some force to be used. Had paid the fare or left the Car when requested to do so no trouble would have arisen.

I very much regret that the disturbance took place, but considering that the Students brought it about and that the Charges which could have been substantiated against them have been withdrawn. I do not think they can state that I have not met them fairly.

I never fail to punish any servant of the Company guilty of disrespect to Car passengers no matter what their station in life maybe, but I think you will agree with me that the proper course is to bring such Cases to my notice and not to settle the dispute on a public Conveyance.
